Reading the Book

Volunteers visit with classrooms to read and discuss the story, either in-person or by connecting to a classroom Zoom with students working from home, or connecting to whole classrooms. Synchronous and asynchronous options are available. Virtual events are available where in-person events are not.

Inspiring Students through Early Career Dreams

I Know I Can is designed to plant seeds of inspiration by encouraging children and their families to start thinking about college and career training from an early age. Research shows that children learn to think of themselves as having higher education and related career opportunities as early as age eight. The I Know I Can program helps open children's minds to a multitude of options available to them, while helping draw connections between academics and future jobs.

Artistic Expression and Public Speaking


After the story and discussion, students are encouraged to draw pictures of their career dreams. While students work on spelling and detailed drawings of their dream jobs, parents/teachers/volunteers are encouraged to help them sound out/spell their career choice and identify which core subjects will help prepare them for their job. To conclude the program, students practice public speaking as they share their career dreams aloud. Where possible, finished postcards are collected and mailed back to students two years later as a reminder of their career dreams and next steps.

Virtual Options

Virtual events allow volunteers to connect with students at home or in the classroom. Break Out Sessions are a popular option for the virtual postcard drawing activity. If Break Out Sessions aren't an option or less than an hour is available, students can complete postcard drawings in advance and share after the story, or they can complete drawings after the event. Students unable to access postcards can draw on paper or the printable coloring sheet found on the ACPE website.

Each event can be customized based on educator preferences.





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
